World Medical Relief responds to Philippines Typhoon Disaster

Detroit, MI. – World Medical Relief, a Detroit humanitarian relief agency is calling for help with its response to the dire need in the Philippines as a result of the typhoon "Haiyan". Philippine's authorities say at least 9.7 million people in 41 provinces were affected by the typhoon. It's one of the most powerful recorded typhoons to ever hit land and likely the deadliest natural disaster to hit the Philippines. Entire villages were destroyed and cities devastated by huge waves and winds of nearly 150 mph.

The collaboration with the Philippines and World Medical Relief is a well-established one and shipments valued over 500 million dollars in medical equipment, supplies and medicine have been shipped to Philippine charities and hospitals in the past. Last year December World Medical Relief CEO George Samson, who is originally from the Philippines met with its Vice President Jejomar Binay and the Chair of the Committee on Health Senator Pia Cayetano to discuss further collaboration to improve access to health care for the poor.

World Medical Relief's Ambassador of Health Dr. David Zarate who is stationed in the Philippines is in frequent contact with the Vice President to coordinate the relief efforts in response to the devastation caused by the typhoon.
